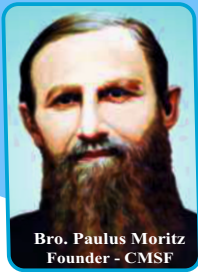

IMPACT - AI

Good Morninng, MumbAI!

Yesterday, I rewatched the National Award-Winning 2006 Film – Lage Raho Munna Bhai. In the movie, Munna Bhai wants to woo RJ Jhanvi by showcasing his exceptional knowledge about Gandhiji (Bapu). This leads him to the library where he spends sleepless nights reading books and understanding the Gandhian principles. He eventually starts hallucinating Bapu and leverages his help to navigate through challenging situations. Everything goes well until a press conference organized by Bhai’s friend, Lakhbir (Lucky) Singh leaves him grief-stricken upon finding that Bapu’s solutions heavily relied on his own knowledge and understanding of the Gandhian principles. At that moment, I was able to draw parallels between Bhai’s hallucination and our fascination with AI.

Today there are umpteen articles, courses and conferences on AI doing the rounds everywhere. We are living in an age where we are open to trying new things (just like Bhai explored the library) and want everything that can be obtained instantly; the road traffic update, our preferred Insta reels and the Chat GPT experience (just like Bhai banked on Bapu’s quick responses to problems). We are thrilled with things that portray human-like qualities and are drawn towards them because they are non-judgmental and resourceful like Alexa and Siri. While AI is being worked upon to reduce human effort on mundane tasks, are we dismissing our ability to perform tasks that we have been introduced to since childhood; answering the door, memorizing the contact numbers of our loved ones and switching on/of appliances?



In the corporate world, recruiters use the Applicant Tracking System (ATS) to collect and sort thousands of CVs. This helps them save time so they can invest that same in screening the short-listed CVs. The ATS is following an algorithm designed by a human. In other words, it is sorting CVs based on the criteria mentioned in the checklist. If there are words/objects/symbols that it cannot interpret, those CVs may never make it to the list irrespective of how strong the candidate’s profile is. Eventually, the recruiters have to screen CVs from a pool short-listed by the ATS (that may not necessarily have the best talent). Reading and making sense of information has been a human trait. Given the pace at which we are operating, we may even deploy mechanisms to ensure the algorithm works more humanly. In that process, we will deprive the coming generation of their reading and interpretation skills.



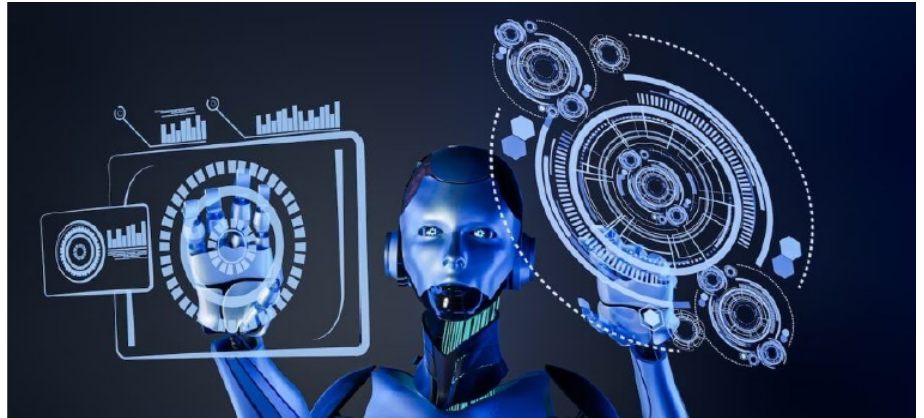

Considering the sentiment attached to the tool, the father may be willing to spend a fortune to get it running. Are we then mocking reality by deploying such tools for immediate gratification?

If given an option, how many of us are willing to deprioritize AI while going about our day? We shouldn’t be surprised tomorrow if we are unable to draft a good email without using Grammarly. Based on the way we function today, AI has started playing an integral role in our lives. As much as we crave a Circuit in our lives, we also need a Lucky Singh press conference to make us pause and reassess the direction we are moving towards. While AI has helped us revamp our way of working, let the term ‘Artificial Intelligence’ always remind us that these tools are human-like but not human. Let us be more mindful of the areas we seek their assistance and ensure that we promote humanness in all our endeavors.

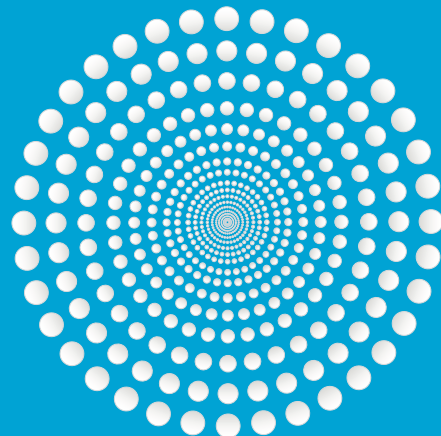

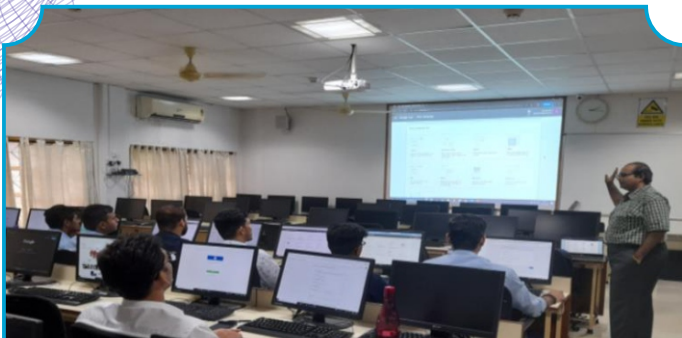

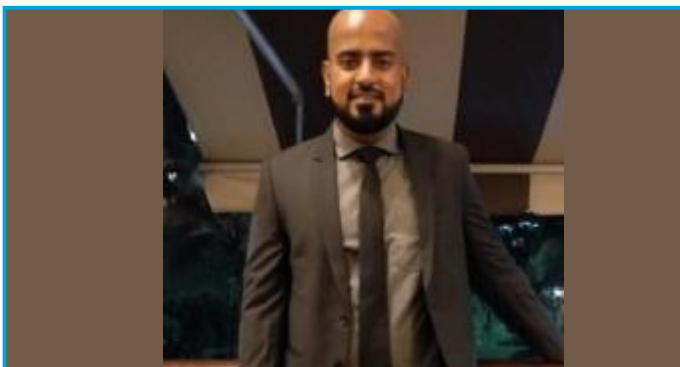
